WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE YOU VISIT

Thank you for planning a tour of the Foxfire Museum! Here is what to expect during your visit:

We strongly encourage that you wear good shoes or hiking boots. Our trails are well-maintained, but the tour is approximately 0.5 mile in length and hilly. It's comparable to visiting a state or national park hiking trail. You should bring water and a snack. There are picnic benches and places to sit along the tour. We do allow those who are unable to walk to drive through the museum.

As you make your way through the museum, be sure to take note of the many interpretive signs located throughout the grounds and inside the exhibit spaces. These signs tell the stories behind the people and cultures of this diverse region. Thanks to the National Endowment for the Humanities, we have been improving our interpretation and these signs are a large part of that process.

Finally, we ask that you refrain from touching surfaces and artifacts to protect our collections.
